

Indigenous Landscape at Taddle Creek



What does reconciliation look like?

Please join Architects and Landscape Architects from the Indigenous Design Studio at Brook McIlroy Inc., as they present concept development for a new landscape design at Hart House Circle. The future landscape will be reflective of Indigenous world views and provide a dedicated place for Indigenous students, staff and faculty to gather, teach and learn as well as to host ceremonies & celebrations.

The project will be one of the first to address the short-term Calls to Action identified in the University of Toronto's response to the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada (TRC). It is proposed in response to consultation with a broad range of Indigenous stakeholders on campus. Existing trees and landscape will influence the design of the site, with the intent to reference Taddle Creek below the surface.

The significance of the Indigenous Landscape at Taddle Creek goes beyond the material. It needs to contemplate: "What does reclamation and reconciliation look like?"
